unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property or in kind contributions. The fund may consist of funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2003, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that a matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 183

(House Bill 53)

AN ACT concerning

Education - Maryland Educational Opportunity Summer Pilot Program - Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Educational Opportunity Summer Pilot Program; limiting the application of this Act to certain counties; authorizing a county board of education to develop a certain proposal; requiring the State Board of Education to review a certain proposal and approve or disapprove the proposal based on certain priorities; requiring the State Board to distribute certain funds for certain purposes to a county board under certain circumstances; authorizing a county board to include certain curriculum or activities in a proposal; requiring a county board to include a certain estimate in a proposal; requiring the Governor-to include a certain amount in the State budget to implement the Program; providing that funding for the Pilot Program is as provided in the State budget; providing that certain funding is intended to complement certain other funding; providing that certain funding for the Program may not supplant certain other existing funding; requiring the State Board to adopt certain regulations; requiring the State Superintendent of Schools to report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Educational Opportunity Summer Pilot Program.
