- 2. SHALL-BE THE DIRECTOR OF REHABILITATION AT A HOSPITAL THAT PROVIDES STROKE REHABILITATION SERVICES; OR
- 3: SHALL-BE THE DIRECTOR OF A STROKE CENTER AT A MARYLAND HOSPITAL.
- (3) (4) If a vacancy occurs for a reason other than expiration of the term, the Governor may appoint any individual without the list.
 - (b) (1) The term of a member is 4 years.
- (2) The terms of 16 OF THE members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Advisory Council as of July 1, 1982. [The terms of those members end as follows:
 - (i) 4 in 1983;
 - (ii) 4 in 1984;
 - (iii) 3 in 1985; and
 - (iv) 5 in 1986.1
- (3) THE TERMS OF FOUR EIGHT OF THE MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED AS OF JULY 1, 2001.
- [(3)] (4) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
