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### CHAPTER 273

(House Bill 789)

AN ACT concerning

#### **Creation of a State Debt - Baltimore City - Theodore Roosevelt Recreation Center**

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed ~~\$500,000~~ \$200,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City for certain development or improvement purposes; providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; requiring the grantee to grant and convey a certain easement to the Maryland Historical Trust; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.
