withholding order be made through the State disbursement unit under certain circumstances; altering provisions relating to the right of an obligor to contest an earnings withholding notice; requiring an employer to send the amount withheld under an earnings withholding order or earnings withholding notice to the State disbursement unit under certain circumstances; establishing a certain criminal offense and imposing a certain penalty; altering the circumstances under which a court may terminate earnings withholding; requiring the Administration to notify an employer to terminate earnings withholding under certain circumstances; making certain conforming changes; defining certain terms; and generally relating to support enforcement and earnings withholding.
