collective bargaining agreement, the Commission [or an] AND THE employee organization, within [20] 5 days after [final budget action, may give written notice to the other party that it is reopening] THE JOINT COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING, SHALL REOPEN the negotiated agreement AND BARGAIN WITH RESPECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT NOT APPROVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCILS.

(p) If a provision in a collective bargaining agreement is ruled invalid or is not funded by Montgomery County or Prince George's County, the remainder of the agreement remains in effect unless reopened under subsection [(n)] (O)(2) of this section.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001 and shall apply to all bargaining cycles that begin after the effective date of this Act.

CHAPTER 302

(House Bill 1127)

AN ACT concerning

Community Colleges - Scholarships Higher Education - Part-Time Grant Program - Dual Enrollment Students

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Scholarship Administration to award certain matching scholarships to certain students who are dually enrolled in a secondary school in the State and a community college in the State; excepting certain scholarship recipients from a certain service obligation; requiring the Administration to provide unused funds from the program of Maryland teacher scholarships to finance the matching scholarships; and generally relating to scholarships for students who are dually enrolled in a secondary school in the State and a community college in the State including students who are dually enrolled in a secondary school in the State and an institution of higher education in the State in the part-time student grant program; requiring certain institutions of higher education to establish criteria for awarding a part-time student grant or waiver to a dually enrolled student; altering a certain definition; and generally relating to including dually enrolled students in the part-time student grant program.
