

(3) IF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIRED REPORTING PROVISIONS WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER BEING CONTACTED BY THE POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION, THE MARYLAND JUSTICE ANALYSIS CENTER AND THE POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION JOINTLY SHALL REPORT THE NONCOMPLIANCE TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That in order to assist local government law enforcement agencies to implement the data collection and reporting provisions of this Act, the Governor shall:

(1) provide for a deficiency appropriation in the State budget for fiscal year 2002; and

(2) appropriate moneys in the State budget for fiscal years 2003 through 2006.

~~SECTION 2. 3.~~ AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, beginning January 1, 2002, data shall be collected under Section 1 of this Act through December 31, 2006, and the Maryland Justice Analysis Center shall issue a final report on or before August 31, 2007.

~~SECTION 3. 4.~~ AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and 2 months and, at the end of August 31, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

CHAPTER 344

(Senate Bill 17)

AN ACT concerning

Scooters and In-Line Roller Skating Skates - Protective Helmets and Headgear

FOR the purpose of prohibiting ~~a person~~ an individual under a certain age from riding in certain places on certain scooters or in-line skates unless the ~~person~~ individual wears a helmet ~~or protective headgear~~ that meets or exceeds certain standards; providing for the issuance of a certain warning; and generally relating to the ~~use~~ operation of scooters or in-line skates ~~by certain persons~~.
