

(c) (1) An applicant for a certificate shall:

(i) Submit an application to the Board on the form that the Board requires;

(ii) Provide evidence, as required by the Board, of successful completion of an approved nursing assistant training program; [and]

(iii) Pay to the Board an application fee set by the Board; AND

(IV) BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.

(2) An applicant for certification as a certified medicine aide, in addition to the requirements under subsection (c)(1) of this section, shall submit an additional application to that effect to the Board on the form that the Board requires.

(3) An applicant for a certificate may not:

(i) Have committed any act or omission that would be grounds for discipline or denial of certification under this subtitle; and

(ii) Have a record of abuse, negligence, misappropriation of a resident's property, or any disciplinary action taken or pending in any other state or territory of the United States against the certification of the nursing assistant in the state or territory.

8-6A-08.

(a) A certificate expires on the 28th day of the birth month of the nursing assistant, unless the certificate is renewed for a [1-year] 2-YEAR term as provided in this section.

8-6A-10.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8-317 of this title, the Board may deny a certificate OR ISSUE A PROBATIONARY CERTIFICATE to any applicant, reprimand any certificate holder, place any certificate holder on probation, or suspend or revoke the certificate of a certificate holder, if the applicant or certificate holder:

(1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a certificate for the applicant or for another;

(2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certificate;

(3) Is disciplined by a licensing, military, or disciplinary authority in this State or in any other state or country or convicted or disciplined by a court in this State or in any other state or country for an act that would be grounds for disciplinary action under the Board's disciplinary statutes;

(4) Is convicted of or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to a felony or to a crime involving moral turpitude, whether or not any appeal or other proceeding is pending to have the conviction or plea set aside;
