AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.

- (B) THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- (1) THE NUMBER AND AGES OF CHILDREN WHO RECEIVED HEARING AIDS THROUGH THE LOAN PROGRAM THAT YEAR;
- (2) THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN WHO RECEIVED HEARING AIDS THROUGH THE LOAN PROGRAM THAT YEAR AND SUBSEQUENTLY RECEIVED HEARING AIDS THROUGH MEDICAID, THE MARYLAND CHILDREN'S HEALTH PROGRAM, OR PRIVATE INSURANCE;
 - (3) THE LENGTH OF EACH ORIGINAL LOAN;
- (4) THE NUMBER OF TIMES THAT EACH ORIGINAL LOAN WAS EXTENDED AND THE LENGTH OF EACH EXTENSION;
- (5) THE NUMBER OF TIMES THAT HEARING AIDS WERE NOT PROPERLY RETURNED TO THE LOAN BANK; AND

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, June 30, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 1 day and, at the end of June 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

AN ACT concerning

Courts Wiretapping and Electronic Surveillance Admissibility of Evidence

<u>Criminal Procedure - Wiretapping - Exceptions for Out-of-State Interception</u>

FOR the purpose of authorizing intercepted communications between certain persons or intercepted in another jurisdiction to be received into evidence in certain criminal proceedings under certain circumstances; and generally relating to admissibility of evidence of certain communications allowing certain information to be used and certain persons to disclose certain information concerning certain communications intercepted in out-of-state jurisdictions in certain proceedings if the interception was made in accordance with the law of the other jurisdiction under certain circumstances; requiring that a motion to suppress the contents of certain communications or certain evidence be made in
