

(ii) Data from school systems and community agencies;

(iii) Current utilization data from client files; and

(iv) Other socio-economic indicators relevant to each State agency, including relative rates of poverty, crime, and workplace accidents.

(f) The Department of Human Resources shall report to the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Commerce and Government Matters Committee on or before November 30, 2001 on the implementation of this Act.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October~~ July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2001, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

## CHAPTER 397

(Senate Bill 548)

AN ACT concerning

### **Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - Reopening of Licensed Premises**

FOR the purpose of requiring in Baltimore City that, except where extenuating circumstances exist, before a licensed premises that has been closed for a certain period may reopen, the Board of Liquor License Commissioners shall hold a public hearing and the licensee shall obtain the approval of the Board; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages and licensed premises in Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

(j) (4) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, AND EXCEPT WHERE EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES EXIST, BEFORE A LICENSED
