AN ACT concerning

Education - In-State Residency Requirement - Waiver

FOR the purpose of waiving the residency requirement for tuition purposes for State, county, and municipal employees public school teachers under certain circumstances at public senior higher education institutions and community colleges; defining a certain term; establishing certain circumstances when a student public school teacher is responsible for in-State tuition; and generally relating to waiving the residency requirement for tuition purposes for State, county, and municipal employees public school teachers.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education

15-106.2.

- (A) IN THIS SECTION, "RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT" MEANS THE REQUIREMENT OF A PUBLIC SENIOR HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION THAT A STUDENT RESIDE HAS RESIDED IN THE STATE FOR 1 YEAR TO BE CONSIDERED A RESIDENT AND RECEIVE IN-STATE TUITION STATUS.
- (B) FOR TUITION PURPOSES, A PUBLIC SENIOR HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION SHALL WAIVE THE <u>IN-STATE</u> RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR A <u>STATE</u>, <u>COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEE</u> <u>PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHER EMPLOYED BY A COUNTY BOARD</u> IF:
- (1) (I) THE COURSE OR PROGRAM IS REQUIRED BY THE EMPLOYER OR BY STATE LAW OR THE COUNTY BOARD TO MAINTAIN THE TEACHER'S PRESENT SALARY, STATUS, OR POSITION WITH THE STATE, COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL EMPLOYER COUNTY BOARD; OR
