10-503.

- (a) (2) Any holder of a license under this article, including a receiver or trustee for the benefit of creditors, may be permitted to transfer the holder's place of business to some other location or sell or assign the license and transfer the holder's stock in trade to another person, but only if:
 - (i) An application for the transfer or sale has been made;
- (ii) All retail sales, amusement, admission, and withholding taxes have been paid to the Comptroller of the Treasury of the State:
- (iii) A bulk transfer permit is obtained if the stock of alcoholic beverages is to be transferred whether by sale, gift, inheritance, assignment, or otherwise, and irrespective of whether or not consideration is paid; and
- (iv) The new location or assignee is approved BY THE BOARD as in the case of an original application for such a license UNDER § 10-202 OF THIS TITLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 476

(House Bill 418)

AN ACT concerning

Drugs and Prescription Records - Impounding and Disposing

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to impound drugs or prescription records held by an authorized prescriber or a holder of a permit issued by a Health Occupations Licensing Board; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt regulations governing the disposition of impounded drugs and prescription records held by a permit holder or an authorized prescriber, authorizing the Department to issue a certain order concerning the impounding and disposing of drugs and prescription records; requiring the Department to issue a certain notice; requiring the Department to give a permit holder or authorized prescriber an opportunity to dispose of drugs and prescription records; requiring the Department to provide the permit holder or authorized prescriber with a list of items being impounded; establishing that a reasonable fee may be charged to cover the costs of impoundment, storage, and disposition of drugs and records; requiring the Department to publish notice regarding the date of transferal or destruction of the drugs and records and designating how, where, and when the impounded items may be retrieved by the permit holder or authorized prescriber; requiring a Health Occupations Licensing Board to immediately notify the Division of Drug Control upon the surrender, suspension, or
