

(1) STATING THE DATE THAT THE DRUGS OR PRESCRIPTION RECORDS WILL BE DESTROYED OR TRANSFERRED; AND

(2) DESIGNATING A DATE, TIME, AND LOCATION WHERE THE DRUGS OR PRESCRIPTION RECORDS MAY BE RETRIEVED BY THE PERMIT HOLDER OR AUTHORIZED PRESCRIBER IF CERTAIN CONDITIONS ARE MET.

(4) (J) A BOARD SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE DIVISION OF DRUG CONTROL OF THE SURRENDER, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION OF A PERMIT HOLDER'S PERMIT OR AN AUTHORIZED PRESCRIBER'S LICENSE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 477

(House Bill 419)

AN ACT concerning

Milk and Milk Products - Regulation

FOR the purpose of requiring a person to obtain a certain permit before the person may transport a milk product; redesignating a milk hauler as a bulk milk hauler/sampler; exempting certain persons from the permitting process; ~~increasing certain fees~~; establishing certain fees; altering the process for appealing a final decision of the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; and generally relating to the regulation and permitting process for milk and milk products.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

21-401.

(a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) "Bobtailer" means a person who operates or controls a Grade A milk route and distributes Grade A pasteurized milk products that the person buys from a Grade A distributor or a milk processor.
