## Article 33 - Election Code

3 102

- (a) Except as provided in[subsection (b)] SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (C) of this section, an individual may become registered to vote if the individual:
  - (1) Is a citizen of the United States:
- (2) Is at least 18 years old or will be 18 years old on or before the day of the next succeeding general or special election;
- - (4) Registers pursuant to this title.
  - (b) An individual is not qualified to be a registered voter if the individual:
- (1) Has been convicted of theft-or other-infamous crime, unless the individual:
  - (i) Has been pardoned; or
- $_{\rm (ii)}$  1. In connection with a first conviction, has  $\underline{\rm HAS}$  completed the sentence imposed for the conviction, including probation; OR
- 2. IN CONNECTION WITH A SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION, HAS COMPLETED THE SENTENCE IMPOSED FOR THE CONVICTION, INCLUDING PROBATION, AND AT LEAST 5 YEARS HAVE ELAPSED SINCE THE COMPLETION OF THE SENTENCE IMPOSED FOR THE CONVICTION, INCLUDING PROBATION;
  - (2) Is under guardianship for mental disability; or
  - (3) Has been convicted of buying or selling votes.
- (C) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A CRIME OF VIOLENCE AS DEFINED UNDER ARTICLE 27, § 643B OF THE CODE IS NOT QUALIFIED TO BE A RECISTERED VOTER.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October July 1, 2001.
