(2) the Board will issue a license to the applicant on receipt of a license fee of \$600.

Except as otherwise provided in this title, a licensed docking master shall be employed for:

- (1) maneuvering [a] EACH AMERICAN vessel ENGAGED IN FOREIGN TRADE AND EACH FOREIGN VESSEL during the berthing or unberthing operations with tug assistance; or
  - (2) ... shifting a vessel within a port with tug assistance.

Before a member of the Board may examine an applicant for a license, the member shall take the following oath:

"I, \_\_\_\_, do (swear) (affirm) that I will impartially examine and inquire into the capacity, skill and experience of the applicant or applicants in providing pilotage and will admit them as I find them qualified or reject them if I shall find them unqualified, without favor or reward."]

## **Article - Public Utility Companies**

#### 4-303.1.

- (a) The Commission shall establish fees and charges for a licensed docking master to provide docking services in the Ports of Maryland at a just and reasonable rate.
- (b) The Commission shall give notice and hold a public hearing on each rate proposal as provided in this article.
  - (c) In determining a just and reasonable rate, the Commission shall consider:
    - (1) the draft, dimensions, and tonnage of the vessel;
- (2) the difficulty and inconvenience of the particular service and the time and skill required to render the service;
