CHAPTER 5

(House Bill 3)

AN ACT concerning

Alcohol Concentration - "0.08"

FOR the purpose of reducing the level of alcohol concentration required for a determination of being intexicated per se in violation of certain alcohol-related offenses; making conforming changes to the level of alcohol concentration concerning a certain presumption of being under the influence of alcohol in violation of a certain alcohol-related driving offense; expanding the applicability of certain evidentiary provisions concerning alcohol concentration levels to juvenile and civil proceedings; reducing the level of alcohol concentration for a certain administrative offense that results in the suspension of a driver's license under certain circumstances; reducing the level of alcohol concentration required for the crime of homicide by motor vehicle or vessel while intoxicated per se and for the crime of life threatening injury by motor vehicle or vessel while intoxicated per se altering certain terminology concerning certain alcohol-related and drug-related offenses; making stylistic changes; providing for the application of this Act; providing for the construction of this Act; providing for the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to certain alcohol concentration levels and certain proceedings.
