10-210. DUTIES.

THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL:

(1) ADVISE THE SECRETARY, THE COURT OF APPEALS, AND THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE COURT OF APPEALS ON THE DEVELOPMENT, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM;

(2) PROPOSE AND RECOMMEND REGULATIONS TO THE SECRETARY NECESSARY TO DEVELOP, OPERATE, AND MAINTAIN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM;

(3) PROPOSE AND RECOMMEND RULES, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON RULES OF PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE OF THE COURT OF APPEALS, TO THE COURT OF APPEALS AND THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE COURT OF APPEALS NECESSARY TO DEVELOP, OPERATE, AND MAINTAIN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM;

(4) MONITOR THE OPERATION OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM; AND

(5) RECOMMEND:

(I) PROCEDURES AND METHODS FOR CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION TO BE USED IN THE RESEARCH, EVALUATION, AND STATISTICAL ANALYSIS OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITY; AND

(II) ANY LEGISLATION NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT, OPERATE, AND MAINTAIN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 27, § 745(b), (c), and (d).

In item (2) of this section, the reference to the "Standing Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure" is substituted for the former reference to the "Standing Committee on Rules" to reflect the current name of that committee.

Former Art. 27, § 745(a), which stated that the Advisory Board shall "perform the duties set forth in this section and those of an advisory nature that may otherwise be delegated to it in accordance with law", is deleted as implied in light of the rules of statutory interpretation.
