- (B) (1) THE HEAD OF THE OFFICE IS THE DIRECTOR.
- (2) (I) THE DIRECTOR IS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.
- (II) THE DIRECTOR SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE GOVERNOR AND IS RESPONSIBLE DIRECTLY TO THE GOVERNOR.
  - THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE: (3)
    - A DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING PERSON, AND
- (II) KNOWLEDGEABLE AND EXPERIENCED AFFECTING DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING INDIVIDUALS.
- (4) THE DIRECTOR IS ENTITLED TO THE SALARY PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
  - (C) (1) THE DIRECTOR OFFICE SHALL:
- (I) ADVISE THE GOVERNOR ON ALL MATTERS ASSIGNED TO THE OFFICE: AND
- (II) CARRY OUT THE GOVERNOR'S POLICIES ON THE MATTERS ASSIGNED TO THE OFFICE;

## (HH) (2) THE DIRECTOR SHALL:

- MANAGE THE OPERATION OF THE OFFICE AND ESTABLISH GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES TO PROMOTE THE ORDERLY AND EFFICIENT OPERATION OF THE OFFICE; AND
- (IV) (II) ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- (2) (3) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE DIRECTOR MAY ESTABLISH, REORGANIZE, OR CONSOLIDATE AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY IN THE OFFICE AS NECESSARY TO FULFILL THE RESPONSIBILITIES ASSIGNED BY THE DIRECTOR.
- (D) THE OFFICE SHALL BE GIVEN ADEQUATE STAFF AND FUNDING TO CARRY OUT ITS DUTIES.

- (A) THE OFFICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROMOTING THE GENERAL WELFARE OF DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE.
  - (B) THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE SHALL INCLUDE:
- PROVIDING, ADVOCATING, AND COORDINATING THE ADOPTION OF PUBLIC POLICIES, REGULATIONS, AND PROGRAMS THAT WILL BENEFIT DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING INDIVIDUALS:
