

- (1) RECONSTRUCTION OF THE BREAST ON WHICH THE MASTECTOMY HAS BEEN PERFORMED;
- (2) SURGERY AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE OTHER BREAST TO PRODUCE A SYMMETRICAL APPEARANCE;
- (3) PROSTHESES; AND
- (4) ANY PHYSICAL COMPLICATIONS RELATED TO THE MASTECTOMY.

[(c)] (D) The Department shall administer the Program through the local health departments using a grant program under which a local health department makes arrangements with health care facilities to provide screening mammograms and clinical breast examinations to eligible individuals.

[(d)] (E) An individual is eligible for the Program if the individual:

- (1) Has a family income that does not exceed 250% of the federal poverty level; and
- (2) Does not have access to health insurance coverage that covers screening mammograms and clinical breast examinations for women aged 40 years and older.

[(e)] (F) For each fiscal year, the Governor shall include an appropriation of general funds to the Program in an amount not less than the amount appropriated for breast cancer screening, diagnosis, and treatment in the State budget for fiscal year 1999, subject to the availability of State funds.

[(f)] (G) The Department shall:

- (1) Adopt regulations necessary to implement the Program; and
- (2) Work with all interested parties to assure that breast cancer screening services are available to women at least 40 years old.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
