violations, within Anne Arundel County; requiring certain notices to the county code enforcement agency and to certain tenants and property owners under certain circumstances before a nuisance abatement action may be brought; requiring that a proceeding under this Act be expedited in a certain manner, providing that a political subdivision may not be subject to certain actions; providing for certain remedies; providing for the construction of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the right of community associations, the State's Attorney for Anne Arundel County, the County Attorney for Anne Arundel County, and the City Attorney for the City of Annapolis to seek judicial abatement of certain nuisances in Anne Arundel County.
