4.5-101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (g) "Home builder registration number" means a registration number issued by the [Director] UNIT to a registrant under this title.

4.5-305.

- (b) At least 60 days before a registration expires, the [Director] UNIT shall mail the registrant, at the last known address of the registrant:
 - (1) a renewal application form; and
 - (2) a notice that states:
 - (i) the date on which the current registration expires; and
- (ii) the date by which the [Director] UNIT must receive the renewal application for a renewal to be issued and mailed before the registration expires.

- (a) The Unit may deny registration to an applicant, reprimand a registrant, suspend or revoke a registration, or impose a civil penalty on a registrant if the Unit determines that the applicant or registrant:
- (9) engaged in a pattern of poor workmanship as evidenced by one or more of the following:
 - (i) repeated unresolved building code violations;
- (ii) repeated unsatisfied arbitration awards IN FAVOR OF CONSUMERS against the applicant or registered home builder based on incomplete or substandard work [that results in a consumer, in whose names the arbitration awards are entered, filing complaints with the Division under this subtitle]; or
- (iii) an unsatisfied final judgment IN FAVOR OF A CONSUMER [that results in a consumer, in whose name the judgment is entered, filing a complaint with the Division under Title 13 of the Commercial Law Article];

4.5-502.

- (a) Subject to the notice and hearing provisions of Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government Article, the Division may bring a civil administrative action against a person that violates § 4.5–501(a) of this subtitle.
- (b) After a hearing, if the [Director] DIVISION finds that a person has violated § 4.5–501(a) of this subtitle, the [Director] DIVISION may:
 - (1) order the person to cease and desist from unlawful practice; and
