SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Spending Affordability Committee shall include a recommendation in its final report of the 2002 interim as to the fiscal prudence of accelerating the phased—in increase of the earned income credit refund enacted under this Act.

SECTION 2-3 AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001 and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2000.

## Estates and Trusts - Intestate Succession - Abandonment or Failure to Support Minor Child

FOR the purpose of precluding a parent from inheriting through a by intestate succession from a minor child of the parent if the parent has abandoned the child or willfully failed to pay child contribute to the support of the child for a certain period of time; making certain stylistic changes; establishing that a parent shall be deemed to have abandoned a minor child under certain circumstances; clarifying that the distribution of a decedent's estate to the surviving parent or parents is subject to certain provisions of law; making clarifying that a surviving parent of a decedent is ineligible to be granted letters of administration or to be appointed as successor personal representative or a special administrator under certain circumstances; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to intestate succession.
