

Prevention on the number and cause of death of Maryland children under the age of 1 year who died during the prior calendar year ending December 31st.

(C) IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTIONS (A) AND (B) OF THIS SECTION, WITHIN 24 HOURS OF NOTIFICATION OF A DEATH, THE SECRETARY SHALL REPORT TO THE MORTALITY REVIEW COMMITTEE ANY DEATH OF AN INDIVIDUAL WHO AT THE TIME OF DEATH WAS:

(1) AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY, AS DEFINED IN § 7-101(E) OF THIS ARTICLE, WHO RESIDED IN OR WAS RECEIVING SERVICES FROM ANY PROGRAM OR FACILITY LICENSED OR OPERATED BY THE ~~DEPARTMENT~~ DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ADMINISTRATION; OR

(2) AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A MENTAL ILLNESS WHO RESIDED IN OR WAS RECEIVING SERVICES FROM ANY PROGRAM OR FACILITY ~~LICENSED~~ APPROVED, LICENSED, OR OPERATED BY THE ~~DEPARTMENT~~ MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION.

The Committee shall:

(1) Evaluate causes or factors contributing to deaths in facilities or programs operated or licensed by the ~~MENTAL HEALTH~~ MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION AND THE Developmental Disabilities Administration or operating by waiver under § 7-903(b) of this article;

(2) Identify patterns and systemic problems and ensure consistency in the review process; and

(3) Make recommendations to the Secretary to prevent avoidable deaths and improve quality of care.

(a) The Committee shall consist of ~~12~~ 18 members appointed by the Secretary, including the following:

(1) A licensed physician who is board certified in an appropriate specialty;

(2) A psychopharmacologist;
