

(2) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBTITLE, AN INDIVIDUAL MAY NOT ASSIST, ATTEMPT TO ASSIST, OR OFFER TO ASSIST IN PERFORMING ELEVATOR INSTALLATION, REPAIR, OR MAINTENANCE WORK IN THE STATE UNLESS LICENSED BY THE BOARD.

(3) A CONTRACTOR MAY NOT EMPLOY AN ELEVATOR MECHANIC UNLESS THE MECHANIC IS LICENSED BY THE BOARD.

(W) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$100 FOR EACH DAY THAT THE VIOLATION CONTINUES OR IMPRISONMENT NOT TO EXCEED 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

(2) ANY PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY AND WILLFULLY VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR, AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT TO EXCEED 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 704

(House Bill 1097)

AN ACT concerning

Adulterated Foods – Increasing the Amount of Alcohol That May Be Added to Confectioneries

FOR the purpose of increasing the permissible amount of alcohol that can be added to a confectionery product before it is classified as adulterated food; requiring a certain warning notice to be placed on the container of a confectionery product which contains a certain amount of alcohol; prohibiting certain persons from purchasing a confectionery product that contains a certain amount of alcohol; excluding a confectionery product that contains a certain amount of alcohol from the definition of alcoholic beverages; and generally relating to alcohol as an ingredient of a confectionery product.
