

(3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLICLY REPORT ANNUALLY THE AMOUNTS COLLECTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2002.

CHAPTER 725

(House Bill 1362)

AN ACT concerning

State Personnel - Law Enforcement Employees - Compensatory Time for Overtime Work

FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the number of overtime hours for which certain law enforcement employees of the Department of State Police and the Natural Resources Police may be granted compensatory time.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Personnel and Pensions

8-309.

(a) The Secretary may designate, subject to the Secretary's salary-setting authority, those bona fide administrative, executive, and professional employees who may not receive payment for overtime work, but who may be granted compensatory time for overtime work.

(b) On or after July 1, 1989, an employee who is included in the Executive Pay Plan at a pay grade of (ES) 6 or above is not entitled to accrue any compensatory time other than as provided in § 9-205(a)(3) of this article for holiday work.

(c) A law enforcement employee of the Department of State Police holding a commissioned rank or a law enforcement employee of the Natural Resources Police holding a rank above sergeant may not receive payment for any overtime work, but may be granted compensatory time for overtime work [in excess of 30 overtime hours in a fiscal year].
