AN ACT concerning

Higher Education – Salisbury State University – Renaming

FOR the purpose of altering the name of Salisbury State University to Salisbury University; authorizing the publishers of the Annotated Code of Maryland to correct certain statutory references under certain conditions; providing for the implementation of this Act; and generally relating to the renaming of Salisbury State University.
