

HALLUCINOGENIC EFFECT ON THE CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM OF A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE CLASSIFIED IN SCHEDULE I OR SCHEDULE II OF THIS SECTION.

DOES NOT INCLUDE:

3. "CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE ANALOGUE"

- (I) A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE;
- (II) A SUBSTANCE FOR WHICH THERE IS AN APPROVED NEW DRUG APPLICATION; OR
- (III) A SUBSTANCE EXEMPTED FOR INVESTIGATIONAL USE UNDER SECTION 506 OF THE FEDERAL FOOD, DRUG, AND COSMETIC ACT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 277 – Baltimore City – Sheriff – Deputy Sheriff Majors and Deputy Sheriffs.

This bill requires the Sheriff of Baltimore City to appoint a second deputy sheriff major and reduces the number of deputy sheriffs the Sheriff of Baltimore City is authorized to appoint from 84 to 83.

House Bill 1181, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 277.

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City – Sheriff – Deputy Sheriff Majors and Deputy Sheriffs
