- (v) (VI) Therapy;
- (vi) (VII) Long term management; and
- (vii) (VIII) Any other services that the Advisory Council thinks should be covered.

(b) A State or county health department that carries out [high blood pressure and related cardiovascular risk factors] HEART DISEASE AND STROKE PREVENTION, EDUCATION, AND TREATMENT programs shall conform to the guidelines established under subsection (a) of this section.

(c) ~~Each year~~ ONCE EVERY 2 YEARS, the Advisory Council shall:

- (1) Evaluate [high blood pressure and related cardiovascular risk factors] HEART DISEASE AND STROKE PREVENTION, EDUCATION, AND TREATMENT programs; and
- (2) Send the evaluation with a report to the Governor.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial additional members ~~of the~~ of the State Advisory Council on ~~Reducing Death and Suffering From~~ Heart Disease and Stroke shall expire as follows:

- (1) 2 members in 2002; ~~and~~
- (2) 2 members in 2003;
- (3) 2 members in 2004; and
- (4) 2 members in 2005.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 338 - Hospitals - Uniform Emergency Security Codes for Hospitals - Establishment and Implementation.

This bill requires the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Association of Maryland Hospitals and Health Systems and the Maryland Association of Hospital Security and Safety Directors, to develop a uniform set of emergency security codes for hospitals.
