House Bill 476, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 338.

## Senate Bill No. 338

AN ACT concerning

## Hospitals - Uniform <u>Emergency</u> Security <u>Code</u> <u>Codes</u> for Hospitals - Establishment and Implementation

FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with certain associations, to develop a uniform set of emergency security eode codes for hospitals; requiring the Secretary to adopt certain regulations; requiring hospitals to implement the provisions of certain regulations within a certain time; and generally relating to a uniform set of emergency security eode codes for hospitals.

BY adding to

Article – Health – General Section 19–308.6 Annotated Code of Maryland (2000 Replacement Volume)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Health - General

19-308.6.

- (A) THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ASSOCIATION OF MARYLAND HOSPITALS AND HEALTH SYSTEMS AND THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF HOSPITAL SECURITY AND SAFETY DIRECTORS, SHALL DEVELOP A UNIFORM <u>SET OF EMERGENCY</u> SECURITY CODES FOR HOSPITALS.
- (B) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE UNIFORM SET OF EMERGENCY SECURITY CODE CODES.
- (C) EACH HOSPITAL IN MARYLAND SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THE UNIFORM <u>SET OF EMERGENCY</u> SECURITY <u>CODE</u> <u>CODES</u> FOR HOSPITALS WITHIN 2 YEARS OF THE ADOPTION OF THE REGULATIONS BY THE SECRETARY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October June 1, 2001.
