

2. An election judge or alternate election judge may not receive the compensation authorized under this subparagraph if the election judge refuses to serve on an election day, unless the local board excuses the election judge.

[(6)] (7) (i) In Washington County, the compensation for each election day actually served shall be:

1. \$100 per day for each chief election judge, plus a mileage allowance as determined by the Washington County Board; and

2. \$80 per day for every other election judge.

(ii) In Washington County, a chief election judge or election judge who successfully completes a course of instruction in poll working shall be eligible for additional compensation, if approved by the Washington County Board and provided for in the County budget.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the Harford County Election Judges in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the Harford County Election Judges shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 447 – Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Caterers.

This bill authorizes a licensed caterer in Harford County to provide alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises, at an event sponsored by the caterer that is held on the caterer's premises each calendar year.

House Bill 218, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 447.
