

(J) AT THE END OF THE DAY FOR WHICH A CLASS BWTS LICENSE IS VALID, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL DISPOSE OF UNCONSUMED ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES REMAINING IN A CONTAINER OPENED FOR TASTING OR SAMPLING.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 556 - Port of Cambridge - Operation and Maintenance by Maryland Port Administration - Jurisdiction.

This bill repeals the requirement that the Maryland Port Administration operate and maintain the Port of Cambridge. It gives the Maryland Port Administration the authority to sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of the port facility in accordance with State procurement law.

House Bill 572, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 556.

Senate Bill No. 556

AN ACT concerning

Port of Cambridge - Operation and Maintenance by Maryland Port Administration - Jurisdiction

FOR the purpose of altering a provision of law to authorize rather than require the Maryland Port Administration to operate and maintain the port facility located at Cambridge, Maryland; authorizing the Administration to sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of the Cambridge port facility; and generally relating to the jurisdiction of the Maryland Port Administration over the port facility located at Cambridge, Maryland.

BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,
