 - (xiii) Postelection review and audit of the system's output.
- £(3) Certification of a voting system is not effective until the regulations applicable to the voting system have been adopted.
- (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a voting system-authorized by law before July 1, 1978, including the use of paper ballots, shall be deemed certified.
- (2) On or after January 1, [2002] 2004, a voting system that uses mechanical lever machines may not be deemed certified.

(a) The State Board:

- (1) May decertify a voting system previously certified if the State Board determines that the system no longer merits certification; and
- (2) Shall decertify a previously certified voting system if the voting system no longer meets one or more of the standards in § 9-102(c)(1)(i) through (iii) of this subtitle.
- (b) The State Board shall determine the effective date and conditions of the decertification.
- <u>f(c)</u> <u>Decertification under this section does not apply to a county if its local board has acted in reliance upon the certification of the system involved and the decertification would have a significant and adverse impact, unless:</u>
- (1) The local board and the governing body of the county consent to the decertification; or
- (2) The State Board determines that the system no longer meets the standards set forth in § 9-102(c)(1)(i) through (iii) of this subtitle.]
- (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a voting system that is deemed certified under § 9 102(f) of this subtitle may not be described by the State Board.
- (2) On January 1, [2002] 2004, the State Board shall descrify a mechanical lever voting machine.
