~~(I) A PROCESS THROUGH WHICH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MONITOR WATER QUALITY AND IMPACTS THAT RESULT FROM A POLLUTION EVENT; AND~~

~~(II) A PROCESS THROUGH WHICH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY THE PUBLIC OF THE WATER POLLUTION INCIDENT OR EMERGENCY AND ITS POTENTIAL IMPACTS TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT.~~

~~(4) THE REGULATIONS DEVELOPED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE:~~

~~(I) A PROCESS FOR POSTING ALL WATERWAYS THAT ARE IMPACTED BY A POLLUTION EVENT THAT MAY POSE A DANGER TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR THE ENVIRONMENT;~~

~~(II) A PROCESS THROUGH WHICH THE DEPARTMENT MAY REMOVE POSTINGS FROM WATERWAYS WHEN MONITORING INDICATES THAT THE POTENTIAL DANGER TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT NO LONGER EXISTS; AND~~

~~(III) A PROCESS THROUGH WHICH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PERMANENTLY POST ANY LOCATION THAT IS A COMBINED SEWAGE OVERFLOW DISCHARGE POINT OR A SANITARY SEWAGE OVERFLOW DISCHARGE POINT.~~
