

(2) The Foundation shall attempt to preserve the minimum number of acres in a given district which may reasonably be expected to promote the continued availability of agricultural suppliers and markets for agricultural goods;

(3) Land within the boundaries of a 10-year water and sewer service district may be included in an agricultural district only if that land is outstanding in productivity and is of significant size; and

(4) Land may be included in an agricultural district only if the county regulations governing the land permit the activities listed under § 2-513(a) of this subtitle.

[(d)](E) The Foundation may not purchase an easement on land which is located outside an agricultural district established under this subtitle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2004, the Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation shall submit a report to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly that evaluates the impact of this Act on the quality of agricultural land preserved and the Foundation's agricultural land preservation activities under the Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation program.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2001.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 377 - Vehicle Laws - Titling and Registration - Time Period Extensions.

This bill changes the deadline for licensed vehicle dealers to submit title certification and all related taxes and fees to the Motor Vehicle Administration from 20 days to 30 days from the date that the vehicle is delivered. The deadline extension applies to all vehicle classes and to title transfers for vehicles titled in the State or other states. It also extends the expiration date for temporary vehicle registration plates from 45 days to 60 days.

Senate Bill 352, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 377.
