AN ACT concerning:

Baltimore County Code, 1998 - Fourteenth Enactment

FOR the purpose of enacting the Baltimore County Code, 1998 and adding one article to the Baltimore County Code, to be designated and known as "Article 13. Public Health, Safety, and the Environment"; to revise, restate, renumber, and recodify the laws of the County relating and pertaining to general powers and duties of various departments and officers of the County, air pollution, flood damage prevention, solid waste, sanitary requirements for boat marinas, swimming pools and bathing beaches, nuisances on public and private property, rodent control, weed control, the padlock law, smoking in public places, public assistance, consumer protection, public nuisance alarms, and false alarms; repealing certain provisions pre-empted by State law; repealing certain provisions that have been declared unconstitutional in a court decision; defining certain terms; providing for the construction and application of this Act; providing for the continuity of terms of certain officials, the status of certain transactions and employees, rights, titles, and interests, licenses, registrations, certifications, and permits; providing for a contingent effective date of this Act; and generally relating to the laws of the County.
