SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 4 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005.

Chapter 270 of the Acts of 2000

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 4-302(e) and 4-307(d) through (h), respectively, of the Health - General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 4-302[(g)] (F) and 4-307(g) through (k), respectively.

DRAFTER'S NOTE:

Error: Function paragraph and uncodified provision of bill being cured incorrectly indicated that § 4-302(e) of the Health – General Article was renumbered to be § 4-302(g), rather than § 4-302(f).

Occurred: Chapter 270 (Senate Bill 371) of the Acts of 2000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the repeal of Article 27, § 486A, as enacted by Chapter 288 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2000, is hereby validated.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Drafter's Notes contained in this Act are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as part of this Act.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
