

- (2) Sensitive areas are protected.
- (3) In rural areas, growth is directed to existing population centers and resource areas are protected.
- (4) Stewardship of the Chesapeake Bay and the land is a universal ethic.
- (5) Conservation of resources, including a reduction in resource consumption, is practiced.
- (6) To assure the achievement of items (1) through (5) of this section, economic growth is encouraged and regulatory mechanisms are streamlined.
- (7) Adequate public facilities and infrastructure under the control of the county or municipal corporation are available or planned in areas where growth is to occur.
- (8) Funding mechanisms are addressed to achieve these visions.

- (d) (2) The commission shall:
 - (i) Periodically recommend to the appropriate public officials programs for:
 - 1. Public structures, improvements, and land acquisitions; and
 - 2. The financing of public structures, improvements, and land acquisitions; and
 - (ii) Consult] CONSULT with public officials and agencies, public utility companies, civic, educational, professional, and other organizations, and citizens about protecting or executing the plan.

- (b) To implement the plan, the planning commission shall periodically recommend to the appropriate public officials:
 - (1) Programs for public structures, improvements, and land acquisitions; and
 - (2) Financing programs.
