2. The Panel shall submit an interim report on or before January 1, 2002 and a final report on or before December 1, 2002.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That in establishing the Panel to study the potential funding needs of the network of trauma centers under Section 2 of this Act, the General Assembly does not intend to provide funding to these trauma centers from the increase in the motor vehicle registration surcharge enacted under Section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 2. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 34

(Senate Bill 368)

AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System - Accidental Disability Applications

FOR the purpose of altering a provision of law that prohibits the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System from accepting an application for accidental disability retirement more than a certain number of years after the date of a certain type of accident; providing for the application of this Act; providing for the termination of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to applications for accidental disability filed with the State Retirement and Pension System.
