(3) (v) Pending the prosecution and determination of an appeal taken under paragraph (1) or (3) of this subsection, the defendant shall be released on personal recognizance bail. If the defendant fails to appear as required by the terms of the recognizance bail, the trial court shall subject the defendant to the penalties provided in [Article 27, § 12B] § 5-211 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE.

(f) Section 12-301 of this subtitle does not permit an appeal from the order of a sentence review panel of a circuit court under [Article 27, §§ 645JA through 645JG of the Code] TITLE 8 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, unless the panel increases the sentence.

(c) "Police officer" means a person who in an official capacity is authorized by law to make arrests and is:

(8) a special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER who is appointed to enforce the law and maintain order on or protect property of the State or any of its units;

(10) the sheriff of a county [and] whose usual duties include the making of arrests;

(b) (3) A police officer may exercise the powers granted by this section when:

(i) 1. the police officer is participating in a joint investigation with officials from another state, federal, or local law enforcement unit, at least one of which has local jurisdiction;

2. the police officer is [helping] RENDERING ASSISTANCE TO another police officer;

3. the police officer is acting at the request of a police officer or State Police officer; or

4. an emergency exists; and
