(e) (2) As part of the application for a State criminal history records check, the driver employed or offered employment by the governmental unit or not-for-profit organization shall submit to the Central Repository:

(ii) the fee authorized under [Article 27, § 746(b)(8) of the Code] § 10-221(B)(7) OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE for access to State criminal history records.

(3) (i) In accordance with [Article 27, §§ 742 through 755 of the Code] TITLE 10, SUBTITLE 2 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, the Central Repository shall provide a printed statement listing the driver's criminal convictions to:

1. the governmental unit or not-for-profit organization; and
2. the driver.

(6) In accordance with [Article 27, § 752 of the Code] § 10-223 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, a driver employed by a governmental unit or not-for-profit organization may challenge the contents of a printed statement or revised printed statement issued by the Central Repository.
