

(10) Permit the waiver of all or part of the provisions of the program for a specific contract if the WSSC determines that the application of the program to the contract conflicts with the WSSC's overall objectives and responsibilities, and provide for the WSSC to report annually to the Montgomery County and Prince George's County House and Senate Delegations on those waivers.

(g) The provisions of this section shall be void and may not be enforced after July 1, 2002.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2001.

CHAPTER 93

(House Bill 877)

AN ACT concerning

Frederick County - Lamar Sanitarium Historic Museum Loan of 1999

FOR the purpose of amending Chapter 225 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999, the Frederick County - Lamar Sanitarium Historic Museum Loan of 1999, to allow the grantee to provide a matching fund consisting of funds expended prior to June 1, 1999; and generally relating to the Frederick County - Lamar Sanitarium Historic Museum Loan of 1999.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Chapter 225 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999

Section 1(5)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Chapter 225 of the Acts of 1999

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:

(5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property[, in kind contributions, or] OR IN KIND CONTRIBUTIONS. THE FUND MAY CONSIST OF funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final. The grantee has until June 1, 2001, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of
