- (ii) By January 1 of the year that is 2 years before the county superintendent's term ends, and by January 1 of the year that the superintendent's term ends, the Harford County Board shall provide public notice in 2 newspapers of general circulation in the county that the Board will conduct an evaluation of the superintendent's professional performance.
- (iii) By February 1 of each year specified in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Harford County Board shall:
- 1. Conduct an evaluation of the county superintendent's professional performance; and
- 2. Share the findings of the evaluation with the county superintendent.
- (iv) 1. By December 1 of the year preceding a year in which the term ends, the county superintendent shall notify the county Board whether the superintendent is a candidate for reappointment. If the superintendent notifies the county Board that the superintendent is not a candidate for reappointment, then the remaining provisions of this paragraph shall not apply.
- 2. The county Board shall provide public notice in 2 newspapers of general circulation in the county whether the superintendent is a candidate for reappointment.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2003.

CHAPTER 76

(Senate Bill 245)

AN ACT concerning

State Retirement and Pension System - Military Service Credit - Maryland National Guard Members

FOR the purpose of authorizing members of the State Retirement and Pension System who are members of the Maryland National Guard and activated under certain sections of the United States Code, to receive a certain amount of service credit under certain circumstances for military service as a member of the Maryland National Guard; providing for a certain limit to the military service credit; and generally relating to military service credit for members of the Maryland National Guard.
