effect October 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

CHAPTER 133

(House Bill 259)

AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations - Licensed Clinical Marriage and Family Therapists - Reciprocity

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (e) [For] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 17-3A-02.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE, FOR a license to practice clinical marriage and family therapy, the applicant shall have:
 - (1) Met the requirements of § 17-302.1 of this article; and
- (2) Provided documentation to the Board evidencing the completion of 60 hours of graduate course work, including training in personality development.
