and <u>8 MONTHS AND</u>, at the end of [September 30, 2004] <u>MAY 30, 2008</u> <u>MAY 31, 2008</u>, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2003.

CHAPTER 165

(House Bill 544)

AN ACT concerning

Crimes - Visual Surveillance - Tanning Room Private Place

FOR the purpose of expanding to a certain kind of room the definition of "private place", for purposes of the prohibition against visually observing, with prurient interest, an individual without the consent of that individual, to include a room where a person has a reasonable expectation of privacy for a certain purpose; exempting from the prohibition against visual surveillance a person who, without prurient intent, conducts otherwise lawful visual surveillance in a health care setting under certain circumstances; and generally relating to visual surveillance of an individual in a private place without the consent of that individual.
