(iii) ~~\$500 \$750 for a beer, light wine, and liquor license FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$750 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE; and~~

(iv) ~~\$250 for a Sunday sale license FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$500 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE.~~

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## CHAPTER 177

(House Bill 817)

AN ACT concerning

Department of Juvenile Justice - Wilderness Pilot Program  
The Task Force to Study Alternative Living Arrangements for Children in  
Out-of-Home Placement

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Juvenile Justice, in cooperation with the Department of Natural Resources, to establish a Wilderness Pilot Program in the State; establishing a certain exception to the requirement that the Department of Juvenile Justice place children in group homes that are operated by a nonprofit or for profit entity; requiring the Program to be operated by the Department of Juvenile Justice and located in a State park; requiring the Program, in cooperation with the State Department of Education, to provide certain educational instruction; making certain provisions relating to education applicable to the educational instruction provided by the Program; requiring the Program to provide certain services; authorizing the Governor to include funds in the State budget for the Program; authorizing the Department to adopt certain regulations; defining a certain term; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Wilderness Pilot Program establishing the Task Force to Study Alternative Living Arrangements for Children in Out-of-Home Placement; providing for the membership of the Task Force; requiring the Governor to designate a chairman of the Task Force; requiring the Department of Juvenile Justice to staff the Task Force; providing that the members of the Task Force may not receive compensation but are entitled to a
