AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Article 88B, § 66 of the Code, for fiscal year 2004, the amounts to be paid to a county or Baltimore City from the State Aid for Police Protection Fund shall be reduced by the following amounts, reflecting each jurisdiction's share of the costs of the State Police Crime Lab:

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## **Article - Education**

## <u>5–</u>216.

- (d) (2) The percentage component shall be calculated as follows:
- (iv) For fiscal year 2004, the county board shall receive an amount that is equal to [50%] 25% 0% of the amount of the percentage component received by the county board in fiscal year 2002; and
- (3) (iii) For fiscal year 2004, the county board shall receive an amount that is equal to [50%] 25% 0% of the amount of the wealth adjusted component received by the county board in fiscal year 2002.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2004 only, for the purposes of § 5–202(b)(3) of the Education Article, the calculation of a county's highest local appropriation to its school operating budget for the prior fiscal year shall exclude disparity grant funds
