- (2) Enforce any provision of this title by injunction or other appropriate proceedings.
- (c) An action under this section is in addition to and not instead of criminal prosecution under § 11–505 of this subtitle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act may not be construed to affect, alter, or modify in any way, the decision in, or results of, Board of Examiners in Optometry, et al v. Richard Spitz, Jr., 300 Md. 466 (1984).

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2003.

CHAPTER 246

(Senate Bill 405)

AN ACT concerning

Drunk and Drugged Driving - Subsequent Offenders - Penalties

FOR the purpose of expanding the types of alcohol and drug related driving offenses for which certain persons convicted of certain subsequent offenses are subject to certain mandatory minimum penaltics of imprisonment for certain periods of time; limiting the circumstances under which certain home detention is included within the meaning of "imprisonment"; repealing certain mandatory minimum penalty options for community service for certain persons convicted of certain subsequent alcohol-related driving offenses; expanding the types-of alcoholand drug-related driving offenses for which a court is required to order certain persons convicted of certain subsequent offenses to undergo a certain alcohol or drug abuse assessment and to participate in a certain alcohol or drug abuse program under certain circumstances altering certain provisions authorizing certain court ordered alcohol programs to include certain alcohol programs certified by certain agencies in adjacent states or approved by the court; and generally relating to penalties for certain persons convicted of certain subsequent alcohol and drug related alcohol-related driving offenses under certain circumstances.
