- (3) AN ELEVATOR REFINISHER AND RENOVATOR LICENSE.
- [(1)] (M) "Moving walk" means a type of passenger earrying device on which passengers stand or walk and in which the passenger earrying surface remains parallel to its direction of motion and is uninterrupted.
- [(m)] (N) "Safety Code" means the American National Standard/American Society of Mechanical Engineers Safety Code for elevators, dumbwaiters, escalators, and moving walks, known as ANSI A17.1—1971, and all subsequent amendments and revisions to it, as adopted by the Commissioner.
- {(n)} (O) "Secretary" means the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation. 12-824.
- (a) The Board shall establish fees for the application, issuance, and renewal of licenses issued under Part III of this subtitle.
- (b) The total amount of fees established under subsection (a) of this section may not exceed, for the 2 year term of the license:
- (1) \$100 per year for an elevator mechanic OR ELEVATOR REFINISHER AND RENOVATOR LICENSE; and
 - (2) \$150 per year for an elevator contractor.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in Part III of this subtitle, a person shall be licensed by the Board as an elevator mechanic before the person creets, constructs, wires, alters, replaces, maintains, repairs, dismantles, or services elevator units in the State.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in Part III of this subtitle, a person shall be licensed by the Board as an elevator contractor before the person engages in the business of creeting, constructing, wiring, altering, replacing, maintaining, repairing, dismantling, or servicing elevator units in the State.
- (e) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN PART III OF THIS SUBTITLE, A PERSON SHALL BE LICENSED BY THE BOARD AS AN ELEVATOR REFINISHER AND RENOVATOR BEFORE THE PERSON ENCAGES IN THE BUSINESS OF ELEVATOR REFINISHING AND RESTORING
- $^{(D)}$ $^{(1)}$ A licensed elevator contractor is not required for removing or dismantling an elevator unit if:
- (i) the elevator unit is destroyed as a result of a complete demolition of a building; or
- (ii) a hoistway or wellway is demolished back to the basic support structure.
- (2) (i) An individual who works as an elevator apprentice under the direct supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic need not obtain a license.
