CHAPTER 281

(House Bill 174)

AN ACT concerning

Department of the Environment – Noise Control and Pollution

FOR the purpose of encouraging a political subdivision to consider compliance with certain standards before acting on a proposed variance request or change in zoning classification; encouraging a political subdivision to consider compliance with certain standards before acting on a proposed variance request or change to consider if the permit or activity will be in compliance with certain standards; altering the membership of the Environmental Noise Advisory Council; repealing an obsolete provision; requiring the Department of the Environment to conduct certain hearings and prepare or solicit certain input before proposing any changes in a certain statute or regulation; authorizing the Council to provide certain advice to the Department; altering the membership of the Interagency Noise Control Committee; ~~repealing certain sound level limits and noise control requirements~~; specifying the terms of the initial members of the Council; and generally relating to noise control and pollution.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) (1) Except as provided in this section, this title does not limit the power of a political subdivision to adopt noise control ordinances, rules, or regulations.
