~~(2) The term of a member is [3] 2 years.~~

~~(3) The terms of the members of a board shall be staggered over a [3 year] 2 YEAR period as required by the terms provided for members of the board in the bylaws filed and approved by the Commissioner on or after June 1, [1993] 2002.~~

~~(4) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.~~

~~(5) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.~~

~~(6) A member may not serve for more than:~~

~~(ii) a total of more than [9] 6 years.~~

~~(7) A person may not be a member of the board if the person:~~
