(Senate Bill 223)

Preamble

WHEREAS, More than 2 decades of research have established that breast-fed infants have lower rates of hospital admissions, ear infections, diarrhea, rashes, allergies, and other medical problems than bottle-fed infants; and

WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics states that human milk is made for human infants and meets all their specific nutritional needs; and

WHEREAS, Human breast milk contains antibodies from the mother that can help an infant resist infections; and
